LESSON 3: THE FALL OF JERICHO ☆

Lessons in this series: 1 2 3 Overview

In this lesson about the battle of Jericho, children learn that even their biggest problems crumble when they put their faith in God.

TOPICS

Believing, Faith, Following God, Joshua, Listening, Obedience, Power of God

AS KIDS ARRIVE (10 MINUTES)

Have an assortment of blocks available for children to play with as they arrive. Ask the children to work together to build a big block wall.

BIBLE VERSE (5 MINUTES)

BIBLE STORY (15 MINUTES)

Gather the children around you in a circle for story time. After the introduction, read the story about Joshua right from the Bible. If possible, use a Children's Bible so it will be easier for the kids to understand.

Introduction:

Joshua and the Israelites had just crossed the Jordan River and entered the land God had promised to give them. Shortly after crossing the Jordan River, God's people came upon the city of Jericho. A big wall surrounded the city. Should the people believe God and have faith that He was going to give them the land He promised, or should they turn around and go back into the desert? Let's open our Bibles and see what God's people decided to do.

Read Joshua 6:1-16, 20 (The Fall of Jericho)

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What did God tell the people to do? (March around Jericho.)
- 2. What kind of trumpets did the priests carry? (The trumpets were made from ram's horns.)
- 3. How many days did God tell His people to march around Jericho? (Seven days.)
- 4. What did the priests do as they marched around Jericho? (The priests blew their trumpets.)
- 5. Did the rest of the people make any noise when they marched around the city the first six times? (No, Joshua commanded them to be quiet until he told them to shout.)
- 6. On the seventh day, how many times did the people march around Jericho? (Seven times.)
- 7. What did Joshua tell the people to do when they heard the trumpets, after marching around the city seven times? (Give a loud shout.)
- 8. What happened to the wall of Jericho when the people gave a loud shout? (The wall fell down.)

Fall of Jericho

CRUMBLING WALLS ☆

When we place our faith in God, even the biggest problems crumble.

TOPICS:

Believing, Faith, Joshua, Miracles, Power of God, Promises

MATERIALS:

Brick or Cinder Block Crackers

DURATION:

Approximately 7 minutes



WHAT YOU WILL DO:

You will explain how God will meet our needs when we place our faith in Him.

WHAT YOU WILL SAY:

Z Explain to the children that the Bible is full of examples of God meeting the needs of His people when we place our faith in Him. One example happened a long time ago. Joshua and the Israelites had just crossed the Jordan River and entered the land God had promised to give them when they came to the city of Jericho. A big wall surrounded the city of Jericho. (Hold up the brick or cinder block.)

Should the people believe God and have faith that He was going to give them the land He promised or should they turn around and go back into the desert? God told Joshua how to knock the wall down without even touching a single stone. The people trusted God and the wall came tumbling down. In the end, Jericho's big wall was no stronger than a crumbling cracker. (Show the cracker to the class and then crumble it in your hand.)

Just as God met the needs of His people in the past, He will meet our needs today making even the biggest problems crumble like crackers.

THE QUIET GAME ☆

A challenging game to see who can keep the quietest.

TOPICS:

Listening, Patience

MATERIALS:

Table or desks

DURATION:

Approximately 10 minutes



WHAT YOU WILL DO:

Begin by explaining to the children that the object of the game is to be as quiet as possible. The person who keeps from making any noise the longest wins the game.

Round One - Have the children sit at their table or desk. The teacher will make funny faces and act silly in an attempt to get the kids to laugh or make noise. After several minutes congratulate any of the children who could refrain from making noise.

Round Two - Explain that round two will be a little harder because the class will be walking around the table or desks instead of sitting down. Once again the teacher will make funny faces and act silly in an attempt to get the kids to laugh or make noise. The person who keeps from making any noise the longest wins the game. After several minutes congratulate any of the children who could refrain from making noise.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Was it hard to keep quiet?
- 2. When is it important to be quiet?
- 3. When is it okay to be loud?

What We Learned:

(Scripture used: Joshua 6:1-16, 20)

Words to Remember:



(Bible versions used are selected to help young children learn and understand the meaning of scripture.)

Practice this verse several times with your child during the week. This will not only help your child to remember the verse, but also it will help to reinforce what he or she learned during class.

Suggested Parent/Child Activity:



Get up early in the morning with your child and watch the Sun come up. Ask your child if he or she ever wonders if the Sun won't rise to light the morning sky? Explain that the question is kind of silly because we trust that God will make the sun shine. We trust God for many things. Take turns naming some of them while you enjoy the sunrise.

Daily Prayer:
