TOPICS:

Honor God, Knowing God

MATERIALS:

Activity page for each child [PDF] Click here Answer blocks [PDF] Click here Scissors, markers or crayons, tape

DURATION:

Approximately 15 minutes

PREPARATION:

Print an activity page for each child.

Print the answer blocks and cut out each block of answers. (Each page contains three sets of answer blocks.)



Have the children write their names on top of the Activity Page. The first row of the Answer Blocks corresponds to the first entry on the Activity page of how they will choose to honor God at home, and so on for the following two Answer Blocks and entries on the Activity Page. Read the first option aloud: I will honor God at home by obeying, have them cut out the blue word and tape it to their paper. If they plan to honor God at home by praying, have them cut out the black word and tape it to their paper.

Repeat the process for the other two scenarios.

Time-Saving Option: Cut out a set of answer blocks for each student ahead of time.

Increased-Difficulty Option: Allow the children to cut out their own answer blocks.

BIBLE VERSE (12 MINUTES)

"No one is like you, Lord; you are great, and your name is mighty in power." Jeremiah 10:6 NIV

This verse will remind children that no one is like God, so He is honored and worthy of praise.

BIBLE STORY (15 MINUTES)

Gather the children around you in preparation for story time. If possible, use a children's Bible so it will be easier for the kids to understand.

Introduction:

Job was a very rich man who loved God with all of his heart. However, Satan took everything away from Job including his possessions, children, and health. Even Job's friends accused him of disobeying God! Satan thought Job would curse God when he lost everything, but Job decided to continue honoring God instead. And God did something very special for Job because he was obedient!

Read Job 42:2 &10-17 (Job was blessed because he honored and obeyed God.)

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Why does Job honor God? (Because God's plans are the best.)
- 2. What does Job do for his friends? (He prays for them.)
- 3. What good things doesJob receive for honoring God? (He receives restoration and increased possessions, more children, a long life, etc.)
- 4. Why should we honor God through prayer and obedience? (Because God loves us, He takes care of us, His plans are the best, etc.)

Read Revelation 4:11 (God is honored because He created everything.)

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Why is God worthy of glory and honor? (Because He created all things.)
- 2. How can we honor God through our actions? (By helping others, praying, attending church, being kind, being honest, etc.)

Conclusion

God is honored because there is no one else like Him and He created everything! He loves us so much that He provided a way for us to have a relationship with Him through His Son, Jesus Christ. When we honor God no matter what happens, He will bless and take care of us.

HONOR BALLOONS

This free preschool activity will help children identify different ways to honor God.

TOPICS:

Honor, Knowing God

MATERIALS:

10 large balloons Permanent marker Large garbage sack

DURATION:

Approximately 10 minutes

PREPARATION:

Inflate the balloons. Then write one of the following words on each balloon with a permanent marker:

- 01. Lie
- 02. Kind
- 03. Mean
- 04. Share
- 05. Hit
- 06. Disobey
- 07. Pray
- 08. Argue
- 09. Thank
- 10. Help

Place the balloons in the large garbage sack for easy, yet controlled, access.

WHAT YOU WILL DO:

Sit in a circle on the floor with the children. Explain to them that the word "honor" means letting God be the leader in our lives and obeying Him because He is our powerful creator. Ask the children to state some ways they honor their parents (by listening, helping, being respectful, etc). Then ask them to come up with ways they do not honor their parents. Help the children understand that the same ways they honor their parents are ways they can honor God.

Pull the balloons out of the garbage sack one by one. Show the class the word on each balloon and read it out loud. Then ask for a volunteer to state if the word honors God. If the answer is no, then the volunteer can sit on the balloon to pop it. If the answer is yes, then set the balloon on the floor where the children can see it. Once each balloon has either been popped or placed on the floor, review the various ways the children can honor God.
